

Trough House Beat

A beat of over a mile on the right bank of the “Big Ribble”, owned by the Society consisting of what might be considered to be two separate beats – the upper part, the Wood Pool, is one of the biggest pools on the Ribble, and a stretch of streamy water to the brook mouth and island. The lower part consists of the Sand Pool and fast run on our bank before forming the run Millstone Hole. Whilst the upper part of the beat is ideally suited to bait and spinner the lower part provides opportunities for all methods. The run into the Wood Pool is good fly water and is linked to the Cross Gills beat.

The beat supports migratory fish, trout and grayling as well as coarse fish. Salmon can be caught throughout the season in the Wood Pool Raid Deep and the Sand Pool.
